



Altus, Ok.-A three-year cotton research grant totaling \$60,000 has been presented to Oklahoma State University by the Oklahoma Cotton Council, according to Harvey Schroeder, OCC executive director.

Divided into three parcels of \$20,000 each year for three years, funds from the grant will be used by Dr. Randy Boman, OSU cotton research program director. Research activities will be centered at the OSU Southwest Research and Extension Center south of Altus. Dr. Boman is also the center director.
